Structure and Duration

The progamme has 4 modules forming the basic theoretical framework for TESOL practice. Each module contains two assignments, which must be completed and uploaded on the NHC Learning Portal. While you are ultimately in command of the time you take to finish the course, we estimate that each module, including assignments, will require approximately 75 hours of study, 300 hours in total. Since this is a distance learning course, there is no specific start date; you may start when convenient for you. As far as course duration is concerned, this is totally dependent on your individual learning pace; however, we can advise you that it takes an average of 2 months to finish the four modules.
