

Total Qualification Time is comprised of GLH; an estimate of the number of hours a learner is likely to spend in preparation, study or any other learning activities including assessment. TQT is directed by, but not under the supervision of a lecturer or tutor. The credit value, where given, for a qualification is determined by TQT, as one credit corresponds to 10 hours of learning.


